

## Special projects - 2018 report for the CECA Board

Task

In July 2016 at the end of the Milan meeting, Mila asked me to serve as coopted member of the Board for 'Special Projects'. Here is an update for my major tasks over the period October 2017 – August 2018.

Report October 2017 – August 2018

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General assistance for the Board, and in particular: - help with procedures - serve as 'memory', share ideas and outcomes from older CECA Boards when relevant	<ul> <li>Made the minutes of the Board meetings in London.</li> <li>Prepared a grid of tasks, which was then checked continuously by Anne-Marie Ëmond.</li> <li>Made an update of the Useful Information for the Board document (27 10 17).</li> <li>Composed a calendar showing an overview of the main activities and duties of the CECA-Board Board in the coming years, with input of other Board members.</li> <li>Collected the information on the CECA Election-procedure for Mila, as starting point for the preparation of the 2019 Elections.</li> </ul>
Cultural Action - together with Jorge Start a research among the membership to find out how 'Cultural Action' is understood and what subthemes are most relevant for the 2018 conference theme.	<ul> <li>I prepared a survey for all National Correspondents, to describe the most common words in their own language, used to indicate their work in museum education and cultural action. I also asked for the common job title for the profession of museum educator. Some other Board members helped me with feedback on my draft versions.</li> <li>Stéphanie Wintzerith and Jorge Albuja took care of the translation into French and Spanish.</li> <li>The survey was distributed in April 2018, but I only received very little response before the deadline of May 15<sup>th</sup>. I wrote several NC's to ask directly for their contribution. This process is still running.</li> <li>In the regional meeting in Lisbon I was invited to lead a workshop in cultural action on 26. April 2018. After my presentation the participants discussed in groups about the vocabulary they use in daily live. During the presentations of their outcomes it became clear that the use of words is reflecting the cultural and historical background and the academic traditions of every particular country. The outcomes of the workshop are used for the survey.</li> <li>For Tbilisi I am preparing a presentation with the first results of the survey. This will be the incentive for a panel discussion on the first day.</li> </ul>

I doubt whether we manage to get that done before Tbilisi.  In short: I spent and am spending quite a lot of hours on this task, but it takes a lot of time and patience to collect the demanded input from the membership.
