From all the proposals received, 16 research papers were selected for presentation at the ICOM CECA 2023 Annual Conference in Singapore.

The participation of the two research officers in the selection of papers is very important in order to know the profile of the applicants, the lines of research addressed and the possible collaborations in other research-related activities.

3. The applied research training workshop

During the ICOM CECA 2023 Annual Conference in Singapore, the CECA 2023 Research Workshop highlighted the importance of research in the new definition of a museum. The structure of a research project and the contents included were discussed. Special emphasis was placed on the importance of the initial formulation of a real problem and a research question as well as its relation to the stated objectives and the organic coherence of the process.




Figure 5. Participants in the CECA 2023 research workshop

4. I Online Training Course on Research Applied to Museum Education (University of Murcia- ICOM CECA)

ICOM and the University of Murcia (Spain) signed in February 2022 a collaboration agreement through the International Committee for Education and Cultural Action for the realisation of the I Training Course in Applied Research in Museum Education with an initial duration of 4 years.

This course is aimed at graduates in Museology or postgraduate students in Museology from Latin American and Caribbean countries who have not received training in research methodology. It is directed by Rosa María Hervás Avilés, lecturer at the University of Murcia.

The course has a duration of 6 ECTS credits (25 hours per credit) and is held in online mode in the Virtual Classroom environment of the University of Murcia. It will be held from 24 April 2023 to 31 January 2024. There are 15 places available for this first edition.

The course is taught by lecturers from the University of Murcia who are experts in online training. It also has lecturers from different universities in Latin America and the Caribbean who participate by offering lines of research, tutoring and monitoring the students' research.

63 pre-registration applications were received from various Latin American and Caribbean countries (Argentina, Peru, Chile, Brazil, Costa Rica, Mexico, El Salvador, Bogota, Venezuela, Cuba, Panama, Colombia, Uruguay...) for the 15 places offered.


