2) President's activities

In addition to encouraging and coordinating general projects, I have had a number of opportunities to represent the CECA:

- Within ICOM bodies through participation in working groups: DEFINE, ICWG (International Committee Working Group), ITC (International Training Centre) Steering Committee, etc.
- Internationally, by responding to invitations to help develop the network :

<u>In Taiwan</u>, a conference on the theme of co-construction for the inaugural session of the NTCM (New Taipei City Art Museum).

<u>Also in Taiwan</u>, on the same theme and best practices, for a one-day seminar organised by the Chinese Museum Association.

<u>In Athens</u>, at a SAREC-supported conference on "Museums in Europe: new definition, new perspectives, identity, credibility, sustainability", organised by ICOM Greece, on social sustainability.

<u>In Johanesburg</u> for the UNESCO Regional Office for Southern Africa, as part of a seminar on "The Legacy of National Liberation Movements in Southern Africa: Museums and Cultural Centres as Places of Learning".

Lastly, some projects that required considerable investment could not be carried out: a workshop project in West Africa that should be able to take place in 2024, an ambitious initial and vocational training project in Tunisia that CECA hopes to be able to resume in 2025, etc.

3) New projects 2023

Young Members Network and Awards

Encourage young professionals to join the network through regular meetings and participation in an annual prize for free attendance at the annual conference.

- Change of name of the CECA
 - As part of a joint study by ICOM's international committees, the CECA Bureau and members will be consulted over the course of the year on changes to the acronyms used to identify international committees. The CECA is hesitating between the possible retention of an old and well identified acronym and the creation of a new acronym renewing the vocabulary used, the term cultural action being now relatively dated.
